Rubric for Argument diagram

1. Statements are true statements. All statements should be falsifiable. Score is % falsifiable.
2. Agreement. Professor will spot-check the argument diagram and assess whether the evidence presented justifies the support/refute arrow or the does-not-support/refute arrow. Score is % agreement.
3. Format. Score is % of arguments that are correctly formatted.
4. Justification. Any does-not-support/refute arrows should be justified. Score is % agreement with justifications.
5. Clear and concise. Score is subjective. Clearer and more concise statements and justifications get higher score. Needlessly verbose, redundant and/or ambiguously stated arguments get a lower score.

Total score is the average of the five scores.
